X. Public Comment on Agenda or any other item of interest to the public.

Lorie Jeskey raised concerns over the parking at the intersection of Arletta Alley and Lenz Avenue. There are a lot of cars parked there and as a result the view of traffic is sometimes obstructed. President Payne advised that our Code Enforcement representatives would be looking at the situation.

Joe Kotula of Forest Rd. brought to the attention of Code Enforcement of young or teenage children at what appears to be a vacant property on Forest Rd. Mr. Kotula was advised to reach out to the Police when he is aware of suspicious activity and in the interim the Code enforcement representatives would evaluate the situation.

Mark Kosk and Mary Kephart of Mayfield Avenue spoke regarding a notice he had received involving the pool he had in his yard. He mentioned that during the Covid 19 no public pools are available, and this was only temporary in nature. The Code Enforcement advised that a permit is required and a proper fence for the safety of the homeowner and the public. President Payne advised to look at fencing options.
