Managers Note: Explanation and Purpose. The LIHWAP begins in PA on January 4, 2022 and is part of an overall emergency effort to prevent, prepare for and respond to the COVID -19 pandemic, with the health force and ensuring that low income households have access to drinking water and waste water services. This program is intended to benefit particularly those with the lowest income that pay a high proportion of household income by providing funds to owners of public water or treatment works to reduce arrearages.

Connie Barlamas- Playground plan is finalized and will be started in September.

**Terry Mylan** - We will make decisions about where the new speed signs will go. Thanks to road crew for painting new signs on Highland before the school year.

Matt - Mentioned the recent car thefts, wants to do a community crime watch crew. Sue Polomo wants to head it.

**Grace Debona** - Asked OIC Brooks and Officer Doug Edgell to talk about how to stay safe in the community. Both reiterated that it's important to lock doors and follow good safety practices.

Fabiola Gergerich - Asked about the investigation by the Police Department, also asked about what is going on with a rental unit that she believes is a "marijuana" unit. OIC Brian Brooks advised that unless people file complaints, there is nothing PD can do about it if they don't know about it. Also inquired about LIHWAP- would the citizens be stuck paying for people who can't pay? Bob explained how the program works and that it would not fall on the residents. It's individual applications, etc. Fabiola also asked about the 2nd extension of the renovation project and how long will the extension last? Explanation is that the grant was received right before Covid, then prices skyrocketed, which is why the renovation was originally extended. She also asked how many speed signs we have, and why is the Township purchasing land and what is their intentions with it? It was explained that undeveloped land could potentially be converted to walking trails, etc. for the Township.

Sandra Charko - Owns the burned property at 602 Stephens Street. Brought paperwork that listed what she believes the property could potentially be worth if it was restored, and said that her structural engineer's review says that downstairs in one unit is in remarkable condition, but it smells, needs cleaned, and needs painted. Her structural engineer says there is no need to demolish it. Bob informed the board and room that nobody has seen these papers before today, which she admitted. Bob explained about the fire escrow, and waiting on plans for the facility. Also advised Sandra that this meeting is not the place for this discussion. Needs reviewed by legal, code enforcement, etc. and needs professional engineer plans for building, or if not, it needs permits to demo. Grace maintained that we need to reschedule this discussion for a different time. Sandra continued to speak about the letter she received from the Township, and said there is no rodent issue at the property, and she has a master's in reading and vector is a math term and shouldn't be applied. Bob explained that it is a term used from the International Property Maintenance code is where the term comes from.

Craig Winne - He had a neighbor with a breathing issue, complimented OIC Brian Brooks and how he handled elderly lady with his compassion.

Lisa Phillips - Her neighbor's property with a fallen tree on it has a sheriff sale going to happen soon, but she is concerned nobody will buy the property. Troy addressed that he was able to track the owners down and they were given time to bring it to compliance. Citations are a next step. Wheels are in motion and the Township is following through with the legal steps. She says it smells, is an eyesore, it's been so long already and she wants it expedited. The tree is still on the house. Fabiola interjected to ask why Frank Presto and the road crew can't do it. Frank explained they can't just go on private property and remove it due to legal and liability issues.

Joe Kotula - Had questions about 42, 46, and 47 Forest Road. Said the person who just moved into 47 is leaving trash out, 42 is where everything is overgrown, and asked why Frank Presto can't trim the house. It was again explained about legal and liability issues. Bob advised that since Joe was last here in February, the Township has made progress on some of the issues. Also advised that Duquesne Light no longer cuts overgrown trees and has not done so for a while.

George Krash - Asked for any updates on the storm sewer project or when they will be paving Forest Road. Jim Norquist explained why they were holding off for now. Also asked if 24th street is a state road, and why are tractor trailers allowed to use the road?

Rosemary Shrum - Asked about the new speed limit signs again. OIC Brian Brooks says they are still deciding the best placement, and again reminded that these are mobile signs but the police are coordinating where the best spots for the speed signs are. She also asked about the needles found by the curb on the property next door and Brooks advised that they are diabetic needles.
