VI. Reports					

- A. Township Manager's Report. The Manager has submitted updates to the Board of Commissioners on a regular basis from the last meeting.

  Manager Villella provided information regarding the Grant that was submitted to the DCED for the Municipal Building Renovation/Rehabilitation in the amount of \$839,000. Information was provided regarding the Forest Rd situation and that Jim Nordquist and Frank Presto went to the site and made the review of the situation. There was discussion regarding the work to be performed through the American rescue Plan funding.
- B. Consulting Engineer's Report. An Engineers Report for the month of February /March 2022 has been submitted.Jim Nordquist of NIRA spoke of the ARPA projects and that survey crews from

NIRA have been to various sites where the work is anticipated top be performed. Bothe Jim Nordquist and Frank Presto spoke of the Forest Road situation.

C. Solicitor's Report. The Solicitor has entered her invoice for services and setting forth the work performed for the month of February/March 2022.

Commissioner Molchen read a statement resigning his position from the Harmony Township Municipal Authority.

Paula Winne, Tax Collector announced that there were two (2) weeks left to pay the real estate taxes at the Discount Period.

Fabiola Gergerich made an inquiry as to the reason for Mr. Provich having requested a change of venue at the Magistrate Court.

Fabiola Gergerich stated that she has concerns regarding the limits on no burning in the Township. Manager Villella stated that 50% of the calls received for the Volunteer Fire Department are based on people burning yard waste.

Commissioner Angus stated the recommendation for no burning was made by the Fire Chief years ago and that was also due to Harmony Township being situate in a basin.

Rosemary Shrum made inquiry regarding the protocol for appointment to the Municipal Authority.

Craig Winne asked about the situation at the intersection of Harmony Road and Lenzman Crt. This was a repair made by the Ambridge Water Authority. Jack Bedalotta asked if anything is being done with the Villas location.

### IX. ANNOUNCEMENTS.

The Township will be picking up yard waste as they do regularly. Township residents should contact the Public Works Department.

Manager Villella advised that he attended a meeting with the Commissioners today regarding 2022 ARPA funding and they are providing a Grant for radios for public safety, which would include police and fire departments, the Grant will be funded on an 80/20 basis.

A reassessment was also performed by Beaver County Commissioners and all properties are reassessed and home owners may receive information regarding their property.
